

Notice of Open Call for Tenders – Reference [2026/BD112/001]

As part of its mission in Bangladesh, MSF wants to launch a call for tenders for the selection of leading water treatment & construction professional companies that can ensure:

Supply and installation of Rainwater Harvesting or reusing plant for HMS (Hakimpara, Camp 14) & JMS (Jamtoli, Camp 15) PHC.

The project includes:

Work 1: Rainwater Harvesting System – HMS PHC

Supply, installation, and commissioning of a complete rainwater harvesting and treatment system at HMS PHC for drinking and potable water use. The PHC has a daily water demand of approximately 10 m³/day (existing storage: 4 × 5 m³ tanks).

The system shall collect rainwater from all designated building roofs, including ER, Isolation, OPD, Mental Health, EPI, Lab, Dispensary, Medical Office, Admin, and Pharmacy buildings. Estimated total annual harvestable rainwater volume is approximately **1,570 m³/year**.

The treatment system must ensure all water quality parameters comply with **Bangladesh and WHO drinking water standards**.

Scope includes supply of all materials, first-flush system, filtration and treatment units, storage integration, pipework, fittings, civil works, breaking and reinstatement of walls/slabs as required, rainwater drainage channels, testing, and commissioning. All affected areas must be restored to original condition after completion.

Work 2: Rainwater Harvesting System – JMS PHC

Supply, installation, and commissioning of a complete rainwater harvesting and treatment system at JMS PHC for drinking and potable water use. The PHC has a daily water demand of approximately 20 m³/day (existing storage: 4 × 5 m³ tanks).

The system shall collect rainwater from Maternity, ER, Isolation, Pharmacy, Lab, and Dispensary building roofs. Estimated total annual harvestable rainwater volume is approximately **1,250 m³/year**.

Scope includes complete rainwater collection system, first-flush mechanism, filtration and treatment units, connection to storage tanks, necessary pipework, fittings, and required civil works (including breaking and reinstating walls/slabs and construction of rainwater channels). All treated water must meet Bangladesh and WHO drinking water standards. All disturbed areas must be reinstated to original condition.

Some work to be carried out will require very strict validation of materials procedures (especially of finishing materials).
